Term 3 commenced on Monday July 15 and will finish on Friday September 20, at 2.30 pm.




School Fees Reminder

OUTSTANDING SCHOOL FEES

As at today we have an amount of \$515, 000.00 in outstanding / unpaid fees. This amount is placing the school under considerable financial strain, as we work to budget and pay our bills. All spending in all budget areas is currently suspended while we wait for parents to pay their fees and for the governments (state & federal) to provide our Semester Two grants. School fees and government grants are our only sources of income. If you have unpaid school fees please try to pay them as soon as you can or enter a payment agreement. If you are experiencing financial hardship we ask you to let us know, so we can assist you with a payment plan.

Once the package arrives, we will send home the reports to our Year 3 and Year 5 families via Australia Post so please look in your letterboxes this week!


Year 5 parents, please note that many high schools request a copy of your child's Year 5 NAPLAN report as a part of their enrolment process.

NAIDOC WEEK AT ST. PAUL'S

During Week 1, the staff and students at St Paul's celebrated NAIDOC Week. NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee. NAIDOC Week celebrates and recognises the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

The staff and students welcomed Majeda Beatty. Majeda is a Sydney based singer, actress and dancer. Majeda shared a performance through song, dance, stories and language representing both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island cultures. She believes in the importance of cultural pride and carrying on past traditions as well as moving forward in a modern world.



NAIDOC Week was held Australia-wide, from Sunday July 7 to Sunday July 14., under the theme of 'Keep The Fire Burning'. NAIDOC stands for National Aboriginal and Islander Day Observance Committee; and, is a week when all Australians celebrate and recognise the rich indigenous cultural history that makes Australia unique. During NAIDOC Week teachers planned activities and provided information to the students, focussing on indigenous culture.

Annabel Cao in Year 5, shares her thoughts, on the incursion attended by all students, on Monday July 15 ... Last Monday, the indigenous dancer, Majeda Betty came to our school. She introduced us to various parts of her culture from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island, such as the instruments they use and how they're made, the clothing and Aboriginal dances. Majeda started off the show with a song called, "Taba Naba," and got children from each grade level to dance with her on the stage. She also used ochre and showed the importance of it - ochre is made from crushed clay and water. Everyone enjoyed it and we learned lots about her culture. It was a great start to NAIDOC week.
