The evening will be an opportunity for parents & year 3 Catholic students to come together and learn more about the Sacrament of Reconciliation.





ASH WEDNESDAY

This year Ash Wednesday is next Wednesday March 5 Ash Wednesday is a very important day in the Catholic Church. It marks the beginning of Lent, a season where we prepare for Easter, which is the celebration of Jesus rising from the dead. On Ash Wednesday, we go to church, and the priest puts ashes on our foreheads in the shape of a cross. These ashes come from the palms that were used the year before for Palm Sunday (the day we remember when people waved palm branches to welcome Jesus). The ashes remind us of something very important: that we are not perfect, and we need to ask Jesus for help to be better. The ashes are also a symbol of repentance. This means saying sorry for the bad things we've done and trying to be kind, loving, and good. It's a way of telling Jesus, "I'm sorry, and I want to be closer to You."

Ash Wednesday reminds us that life is short and that we should think about how we can be more like Jesus. During Lent, we try to grow in love and do special things, like praying more, helping others, and making small sacrifices (like giving up candy or something we really like). This helps us get ready to celebrate the joy of Easter when we remember how Jesus died for us and then came back to life! So, Ash Wednesday helps us start this special time of Lent by focusing on being kind, loving, and trying to be more like Jesus.

BRIMBANK COUNCIL RESILIENCE SURVEY

On Monday our students in Years 3-6 completed a survey run by Brimbank Council. There are 17 Primary Schools in Brimbank that take part and more than 4000 schools in Australia. This data will provide insights into how Connected, Respected and Protected our students feel at school and within the community. It will guide our school to ensure our Wellbeing Programs are aligned to the needs of our students.

MEDICATION & MEDICAL ACTION PLANS

If your child has a need to take regular medication at school, you must provide the school with their medication and a Medical Action Plan, which will detail medication dosage and times when the medication is to be administered; the Medical Action Plan must be filled out and signed by your family doctor. This is essential for conditions such as asthma and severe/life-threatening allergies (anaphylaxis); Asthma Action Plans must be provided every year.

INTERVENTION AT ST. PAUL'S IN 2025

At St. Paul's we implement a multi-tiered system of support to ensure the needs of all students are identified and met; this support is provided across the domains of health & well-being and behaviour & learning; we call this approach, 'intervention'.

At St. Paul's, the interventions currently planned and in place include:

- · Literacy Leader planning with and supporting teachers and students
- · Maths Leader planning with and supporting teachers and students
- \cdot Social & Emotional Groups, inclusive of Dungeons and Dragons for senior students & self-advocacy for our juniors and middle school students
- · Mental Health in Primary School Program support for students, through mediation

• Speech Therapist consulting with and supporting speech needs of students and completing Speech & Language Assessments

- · Psychologist consulting with and supporting teachers, students, parents, guardians & carers
- · MACS Learning Consultants supporting students with diagnosed learning challenges
- · MACS Learning Consultants supporting students identified as gifted or talented

 \cdot Canine Comprehension program to support students' emotional regulation and to further develop their resilience

• Sensory Pod to support students with sensory input / overload, the need to develop self-regulation skills and to support preparation for social and academic settings.

The Interventions listed above are in place to allow every student to fully flourish.
